BYLAW NO. 06 – 04

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH A HAYING POLICY FOR THE MUNICIPALITY IN PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 8 AND 12 OF THE MUNICIPALITIES ACT.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Wellington No. 97 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Short Title

1. This Bylaw may be referred to as the Haying Policy Bylaw

Purpose

2. The purpose of this Bylaw is to establish conditions for the salvage of hay from a road in the municipality.

Definitions


3.
 - a) “municipality” means the Rural Municipality of Wellington No. 97
 - b) “road” means a “public highway” as defined by *The Municipalities Act*.
4. Conditions for the salvage of hay from a road in the municipality:
 - a) The adjacent landowner or lessee, in the case of rented land, has first option to salvage hay along municipal roads. Other persons must contact the adjacent landowner or lessee to salvage the hay on or before July 8th of each year.
 - b) After July 8th of each year, any person may cut and salvage hay without the permission of the adjacent landowner or lessee, provided the adjacent landowner or lessee has not begun salvage operations
 - c) The right-of-way must be left in a neat appearance by the person salvaging the hay.
 - d) Bales of hay must be at least 8 metres from the edge of the shoulder of the road.
 - e) All bales must be removed no later than August 8th of the year.
 - f) Council reserves the right and privilege for its members, employees and/or agents to enter upon said right-of-way for the maintenance and or re-construction of said road or for other such purposes as may be deemed necessary, and at no compensation or reimbursement to the party salvaging the hay.
 - g) The municipality assumes no liability for laborers, machinery or bales relating to the salvage of hay.
 - h) In order to minimize hazards to motorists and to facilitate the maintenance of the roads, hay bales not removed by August 8th and not meeting the requirements of item d. may be removed by the municipality and shall become the property of the municipality.

- i) No person shall cut hay on any portion of a public road located in this municipality during the period of one half hour after sunset until one half hour before sunrise.
- j) No person shall cut hay on any portion of a public highway located in this municipality so as to obstruct the traveled portion of the road.

5. That bylaw No. 91 – 1 is hereby repealed.
